WHERE AND WHEN TO GET CARE

Doctors Office

It is best to see your doctor for problems that are not urgent. Your doctor knows your health history and can access your medical records. * Child & Teen Checkups (C&TC)
* Minor illnesses: strep throat, ear and sinus infections, cold and flu-like symptoms, sore throat, bladder infection * Medication management * Seasonal allergies * Follow-up care to illnesses or injuries * Vaccinations * Any conditions noted on Urgent Care section

Urgent Care

Non-emergencies – after hours, weekends and holidays * Minor illnesses: strep throat, ear and sinus infections, cold and flu-like symptoms, sore throat, bladder infection * Headaches and migraines * Skin Treatments: rash and skin infections, cuts
* Injuries: strains, sprains, and minor broken bones * Dental pain

Emergency Room:

Only go to the emergency room for a true emergency – *wait times can be long * Heavy bleeding * Large open wounds * Chest pain * Major burns * Severe head injury * Trouble breathing * Signs of stroke (sudden change in vision, weakness, trouble talking)
